IN MEMORIAM: KAMLESH SHARMA 1938 -2016



We are deeply saddened to report that *Kamlesh Sharma*, passed away on 21st December 2016 after a long battle with cancer. *Antyeshti Sanskar and Antim Kriya* were performed in a private ceremony by her family. Kamlesh spent the first several of her almost 50 years in the U.S. raising her children before obtaining her Ph.D. at Western Michigan University and joining its science studies staff. She taught ethical aspects of biology before retiring from WMU. An avid reader, gardener and gifted pottery maker, she took flying and painting lessons after retirement. She excelled at badminton, bridge, and golf, winning several city tournaments here as well as at Nairobi, Kenya. She loved to entertain and her recipes (for English trifle, and several delectable Punjabi dishes) went around a large coterie of *desi* food aficionados. She was married to Visho Sharma. They have been a long time residents of Kalamazoo. Their family includes four children (Namita, Radhika, Sujit, and Rahul), and seven grandchildren. Her family is planning to commemorate her life and its many contributions to the common weal next spring. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL BODY MEETING HELD ON SUNDAY, NOV 13th, 2016

Present: Total 50 community members, including the Board of Directors, attended the meeting at IACCT.

The meeting convened at 12:00 PM at the temple.

Vijay Sood, Chairperson, welcomed the community members and called the meeting to order.

1. Panditji recited slokas for an invocation of the meeting.
2. Vijay Sood shared the proof of mailing with the attendees.
3. Copies of the 2015 General Body meeting minutes were distributed to the attendees.
4. Kailash Bafna proposed and Damodar Golhar seconded the motion to approve the 2015 meeting agenda and the minutes of 2016 GB meeting, which were published in January 2016 Newsletter. The motion carried unanimously.
5. Thereafter the agenda was followed. All major accomplishments during 2016 were shared with the attendees.
6. Vijay Sood thanked all the Board of Directors and Support Committee Chairs for their contributions. Major accomplishments for the year 2016 include: Mahalakshmi Kumkums Archana followed by Homa, Bal Vikas group, regular meets of Swadhaya, Swaminarayan group, Sanskrit classes, Hindi classes, Yoga classes led by Sudhir Reddy and others activities by various community members throughout the year.
7. Sujatha Krishnamurthy shared the highlights of the Religious committee. Sujatha spoke about the Peace Run group who chose to stop in to pay a visit at our temple. Youth group and their parents along with many families actively participated in the program. It was a great experience for all those in attendance. This event enhanced status of our community. Our temple photo about the visit was posted on their website.
8. City of Portage invited a member from our temple for an invocation prayer for one of their monthly meetings. Temple feels proud that Sujatha accepted their invitation. She recited some shlokas in their meeting. This incident has raised the awareness of our temple in Portage. We have been invited again for another monthly meeting for an invocation prayer. Pradeep Sagdeo has kindly accepted the invitation.
9. Students from some of the nearby colleges like Davenport College and Kalamazoo College visited our temple as a part of their interfaith or world religions learning experience.
10. Sujatha thanked Pradip Sagdeo, Padmanabh Bhatt and Indiraben Bhatt along with Panditji for their contributions in the accomplishments of 2016 for Religious committee.
11. Sujatha Krishnamurthy also shared the highlights of the Bal Vikas Committee for the year 2016. Bal Vikas children meet every satsang week for two hours which includes learning bhajans and shlokas, listening to stories, learning simple but important question about our culture and rituals. The syllabus designed by Sunder Hattangadi, has been used at the temple for over 5 years. Books are ordered from Chinmaya Mission. This is also accompanied by Hindi classes conducted by Poonam Gulia. All children can recognize Hindi alphabet and can make 2-3 letter words in Hindi.
12. In April, on behalf of Ram Navami celebration at the temple, two groups of Bal Vikas children presented two skits that were very well received and appreciated by community members. On October 9th, sixteen Bal Vikas children performed Raas Garba celebrating Durga Ashtami. On June 12, Bal Vikas had a graduation celebration. About 11 children attended the function. A special pooja was performed by Padmanabh Bhatt. Bhadra Shah presented awards to the children and Indiraben Bhatt handed Certificates of Accomplishment to them.
13. Chetan Vyas presented the financial highlights for the year 2016. He mentioned that the temple is free of all debts. He pointed out that \$3,450 collected by IACCT Youth Group last year was donated to Menaba Charitable Trust fund in April 2016. The DITR project was finally closed in April 2016. Additional DITR donations were received during January - April 2016 period. A plaque recognizing DITR donors was installed in the temple foyer.
14. Chetan acknowledged and appreciated that Panditji is working very hard and performing poojas outside the temple for devotees. This helps our temple provide service to the community and is a great source of revenue. Panditji has also well maintained all the receipts of the poojas performed outside the temple.
15. Chetan updated that now we have 37 Life Members. He also added that our annual memberships have continued to decrease during the last two years and encouraged board members to improve it.

16. Our Cash flow increased by approximately \$20,000 donations, a majority of which came for DITR funds. Since the DITR project is over we have a separate donation fund which can be used for planning capital improvement projects like painting, deep cleaning of carpets, polishing the deities etc.
17. Chetan brought up the idea of audit and annual inventory audit which would make us more organized and systematic. Kailash Bafna added on that since our temple is a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organization, auditing would keep us updated and transparent. Kailash suggested that two individuals can go through the list of all the assets and keep the list updated periodically.
18. Om Jolly as a member of Election Committee, shared that three nominations were received for the 3 outgoing board members. Thus *Sujatha Krishnamurthy, Prabha Ravi, and Amarsena Sappidi* were declared elected to the board for a new three year term expiring on December 31, 2019. Members and Board thanked the three members of the Election Committee *Virendra Sood, Chair, Om Jolly and Chandrakant Patel* for their dedicated service for almost 20 years.
19. Member comments: Damodar Golhar expressed his concern about observation that sometimes people have started eating lunch or dinner before the aarti. He requested that we should keep our tradition of eating after aarti. Pradeep Sagdeo beautifully explained that in our tradition we do “Shola Sur Upchar Puja” which means that we invite God. We bath him, offer flowers, do aarti, do tika just like we treat our guest with utmost love and respect so he also validated that eating before guest does not seem good. Vijay Sood expressed that sometimes logistics of feeding so many attendees on special satsang in the evening is very hard. It was suggested that since this is an operational issue, therefore board members should take it up.
20. Kailash Bafna shared his past experience. The temple was started through hard work and a large amount of money raised through fundraising by several dedicated individuals. We should strive to bring the vigor in our community members to participate more. He stated that let us not forget the objective - Temple is our second home where we get together and pray, in addition of social gathering and enjoying delicious food.
21. IACCT Youth Group activity has diminished to virtually nothing. Vijay Sood added that because of lack of participation, IACCT Youth Group will be put on hold until further notice. Anyone interested in the issue may come to the Board meeting to discuss it, if needed.
22. Hari Bhargava talked about his observation that day to day operation is run by only a few dedicated volunteers. He said that more members should come forward and volunteer. He also added that there were almost 465 attendees at the last Diwali program at the temple, while only about 50 members turn out at the annual General Body Meeting, which does not speak well about the involvement of the community at large. He said that “my pitch is to participate, participate, and participate.”
23. In the Questions forum, Panditji expressed his opinion. He was not in favor of holding the memorial service in the main pooja hall. He said our temple does not have a community hall. Pradeep Sagdeo seconded his opinion and said that there is a custom called “sootak” which has been followed by Indian community for ages. After some discussion, it was decided that the matter will be resolved through further deliberations amongst Board members.
24. Lastly, Mr Dwarkanath shared his experience in the temple as very welcoming. His son is having a great time in the Bal Vikas group where he met many friends and is also learning things that he would have learned in India. This experience in the temple still keeps them tied to India and they feel that the temple as their second home. He requested the board to consider lowering the price of pooja since that may bring more people to participate.
25. Vijay Sood thanked the outgoing Board members for their service, welcomed new Board members, and thanked everyone for attending the GB meeting. The meeting was adjourned around 1:30 pm.
